Dear Counsel:

This ruling is with respect to the motion of Dr. Alan Zimble and Mrs. Cindy Zimble ("Plaintiffs") for reargument (Doc. # 21) of my letter ruling and order of July 28, 2003.

Plaintiffs have not argued that there is any new evidence, an intervening change in controlling law, or a need to correct a clear error of law or prevent manifest injustice. Rather, Plaintiffs now assert that their deposit should be deemed to be held in trust by reason of specific Delaware or

Maryland statutory provisions. These statutory provisions are cited for the first time in the motion for reargument. Neither the complaint nor any prior pleadings by Plaintiffs contain any reference to these statutory provisions. If Plaintiffs wish to plead these statutory provisions as a basis for relief, they may seek to do so pursuant to Rule 7015, but not by motion for reargument. The motion is therefore denied.
